Dreamcatchers Headstart Program

This enrichment program is for children up to six years of age living on-reserve. Learning opportunities acknowledge each child's learning style and developmental stage, and allow children to explore who they are and the world around them. Every day includes a strong focus on health, hygiene and nutrition. Traditional First Nations teachings occur in the classroom, on the land and at cultural cabins.

Caregivers are their child's first and best teacher, and are required to participate, through attendance, fundraising, etc., in this program.

This program will put your young child on the path to success in school. There are no registration fees, and transportation and nutritious snacks are provided daily free of charge.

Immunization and Vaccination Program

Now more than ever, it is clear that NCN children must receive immunizations for their own safety, and to increase the "herd immunity" of Nisichawayasihk Cree Nation. Receiving vaccinations ensures your child and all Citizens, especially those with health conditions, can be protected from disease.

The Public Health team contacts young parents to set up appointments for their babies at the NCN Nursing Station. Older children receive their shots at school from public health nurses. If you hear that your child missed a vaccination, please contact us so we can make sure your child's immunity stays on schedule.

Citizens of all ages are encouraged to receive the flu vaccine every winter. Of course, this year, you should receive your COVID-19 vaccine as soon as you are eligible.

All recommended immunizations are free. They are safe, quick and easy. They feel like a bee sting, but they have health benefits that will last a lifetime!

This program is an essential service and continues during the pandemic.

Granny and Grandpa Cabins in Nisichawayasihk Cree Nation

“Jack and Alice Moore Traditional Program”

As soon as you walk into the little granny cabin, you can smell freshly brewed tea and wood burning from the woodstove. You are greeted with the warm smiles of the grannies, Thelma Bonner and Clara Hart, along with their apprentice Xena Spence. The grannies sit at their table sewing and beading all day long. They teach these treasured traditional Nehetho crafts to the students at

Nisichawayasihk Noyo Ohtinwak Collegiate and Otetiskewin Kiskinwamahto-wekamik Schools.

When you walk into the Grandpa cabins, you are also greeted with laughter, smiles, and warmth. The grandpas are Joe Flett, Matthew Wood, and Darrell Moore. The grandpas teach the students from K to 12 how to make snowshoes, dream catchers, soap stone carvings and even SpongeBob SquarePants medallions. The work that these Elders do with our children is truly a gift.

The granny and grandpa cabins are warm,

calm, and very inviting to children and staff alike. The Grannies and Grandpas are the unsung heroes of Nisichawayasihk Cree Nation and we honour them for the invaluable love that they give

our children and the knowledge and wisdom that they share. Fittingly, the program is named after two of our late Elders who devoted their lives to sharing our traditional culture, language, teachings, and traditional knowledge with the community of NCN. Kinanaskomitinawaw!



Footprint Lake Water Levels

Footprint Lake 14-Day Water Level Forecast

Revised Forecast as of January 19, 2021

On January 19, 2021 the level of Footprint Lake was at an elevation of 799.2 feet. The level of the lake is expected to rise 1.2 inches to an elevation of 799.3 feet by the end of the month.

The 14-day forecasts are estimates, and subject to change. Northern forecasts are broadcast on local radio stations at the beginning of every month.
