ATEC Staff Move into New Facility

"I'm pleased to announce that effective February 22, the administration of NCN's fully accredited, post-secondary training facility in Nelson House – the Atoskiwin Training and Employment Centre of Excellence – has moved into the new facility," said NCN Councillor and ATEC Chair and President W. Elvis Thomas.

Although ATEC has existed since 2003 and has already trained about 280 NCN Members, it has had to rely on temporary space until now.

"I want to thank our staff, board, funders and partners for their support, as well as our present and past trainees for their patience and perseverance in studying under less than ideal conditions," said ATEC Executive Director Ezra Bogle.

Staff are now working to prepare the facility to house all training programs.

"We will be officially opening the new facility to the community in the near future," Councillor Thomas said.



In the meantime, ATEC will be ramping up activities until it is fully operational in April.

"Even before our move, we had already begun operating the 10-month, basic electrical training program in the new fully equipped electrical workshop," Mr. Bogle said.

"I would invite anyone seeking information about our programs, wanting to register or having any other business with ATEC, to visit us at our new location."



A Preview of Our First Class Facility

The new ATEC building occupies about 28,000 square feet, which includes the educational facilities, a dormitory, a daycare centre and an Internet café. It is designed for later expansion if needed to accommodate demand.

The campus provides three classrooms, a science lab, a computer lab, industrial shops including a machine shop, metal shop, welding shop, and a woodworking and carpentry area to provide hands-on training for trades programs. The facility also has a cafeteria and student lounge areas.

Designed for Flexible Use

ATEC is designed for both day and evening activities. For example, the computer lab serves as an Internet café in the evening, using lighting, window treatments and other features to create a more relaxed environment.
