Rules and Regulations

NCN Golf Tournament

Flights and Tees

- This tournament is a 36-hole event with flighting to take place after second round of golf. In the event of rainy weather, placements will be determined by total number of holes played by all players registered in the given category.
- Special events listed below will be determined either by draw or an appropriate skills challenge to be determined by the Tournament Committee
- Men and senior men will play white tees on the front 9 and blue tees on the back 9.
- Ladies will play from the red tees on the front and back 9.
- Tournament will start Saturday, 8:30 a.m. On Sunday, TEE TIMES will start at 8:30 a.m. and will be posted after play is completed on Saturday at the Thompson Golf Club.
- It is the player's responsibility to find out their tee times. Being late for your Tee Time on Sunday will result in DISQUALIFICATION. No exceptions.
- Minimum of five (5) entries are required to form a flight for seniors. If the minimum entries are not achieved the flight will be cancelled and players will have the option of competing in the adult category.
- Players can only enter one category; for example, seniors cannot play in both senior and adult categories.
- For this tournament, a senior is considered 50 years

On the final day of the tournament, cash prizes for the following events will be paid out for Saturday and Sunday based on the number of entries except where a payout is guaranteed. To qualify for each day, players will pay an additional entry fee for each event as outlined below.

a) Long Drive Competition (\$10.00 per day)

- Men's Long Drive Hole #2 and #11 front and back 9
- Senior Men Long Drive Hole #6 and 15 front and back 9
- Ladies Long Drive Hole # 9 and #18 front and back 9
- Senior Ladies Long Drive Hole #7 and 16 front and back

b) Closest-to-the-Pin Competition (\$20.00 per day)

The NCN Golf tournament guarantees \$500.00 per day for Closest to the Pin.

- \$250.00 for Men's closest to the Pin Hole #3 & 12 front and back 9
- \$250.00 for Ladies closest to the Pin Hole #5 & #14 front and back 9

c) High/Low Competition (\$5.00 per day)

On the last day of the tournament, tournament organizers will randomly select a hole for any player's highest score and another hole for a player's lowest score. The pot will be split between two holes. Ties will be broken by drawing a name from qualifying names.

e) Skins (\$20.00 per day)

Skins will be opened to both the men and women's flights.

f) NCN Flight (\$25.00)

The NCN Flight is a special event sponsored by Chief and Council for registered citizens of the Nisichawayasihk Cree Nation. Any NCN citizen who lives on or off reserve can enter this event. To qualify for this event, each NCN member is expected to pay an additional \$25.00.

Door Prizes

Door prizes are provided by tournament sponsors, which are open to all registered players at no additional cost. The players' names will be placed in a draw and names will be drawn on the last day.

Etiquette – Pace of Play

- Be ready to play when it is your turn.
- One practice swing is normally enough.
- Keep up with the group in front of you. If you are slow, try to catch up or let the group behind play through.
- Watch the shots of everyone in your group.
- Play ready golf if your group is falling behind.
- Line up your putt while others are putting and be ready to play when it's your turn.
- Don't replay missed putts.
- Record scores on the next tee, not on the putting green.
- When playing from a cart: place your bag or park your cart between the green and next tee.

Water Hazards

- A yellow line defines all water hazards on holes # 4, 6, 7 and 9. Drop areas for water hazards. Play as far back as you want from point of entry. One stroke penalty.
- A red line defines a lateral water hazard. Drop your ball 2 club lengths not closer to the hole. Play as it lies or go to drop zone with a one-stroke penalty.

Out of bounds\Lost Ball

• Out of bounds are white fences or marked with white stakes. These marked areas are the road on the right hand side of Hole #1 and #2. Out of bounds is a one (1)-stroke penalty plus distance. If you suspect your ball is hit out of bounds or potentially lost you are to play a provisional ball(s). In the event you do not hit a provisional and then find your ball out of bounds or lost, you must go back to replay from the point you last hit the ball.

Rules

- A player's scorecard is to be kept by another player. Play "A" keeps player "B's" score, player "B" keeps player "C" and so forth. Every player attests his or her score after each hole.
- RCGA and local rules on the scorecard (except local rule # 3) apply to this tournament.
- Winter rules are in effect, you may bump the ball up to 6 inches using the head of your club anywhere on your own fairway.
- Relief is taken to the nearest point of relief not nearer the hole with a free drop for the following conditions:
 - Ground Under Repair marked with white paint;
 - Casual water can be called on the fairway, bunkers or rough but not in marked water hazards.
- Any doubt as to rules, play 2 balls and bring the questioned ruling to the tournament committee. Committee's decision is final.
- In the case of rules on the scorecard being different than the above rule descriptions, the rule descriptions will over rule.
